



Dear Brothers and Sisters:

This week was a very sad week; one of our youth in the prime of life was taken away by the cold hand of death. This is a tragedy and the question that we need to answer is how we should respond to this untimely death. As I reflect on this matter I am drawn to a passage of Scripture Found in PROVERBS 27:1 "Do not boast about tomorrow, for you do not know what a day may bring forth." If we are completely honest, we are all guilty of procrastinating from time to time. Let's face it, there are certain tasks that are really hard to get motivated to do like: Cleaning out a closet or a storage room or going through stacks of old newspapers and magazines or returning phone calls to people you dread talking too! But sometimes we procrastinate when it comes to doing some really important things such as: going to the doctor for important things. Have you procrastinated on making that dentist appointment because you are afraid of dentists? Have you procrastinated on getting that physical checkup because you are afraid of what the doctor might tell you? If you will carefully examine the things you procrastinate on most often, chances are it is because of fear. And there are times when we procrastinate when it comes to important spiritual matters, such as reading our Bible or spending time in prayer or giving up a sinful habit or talking to loved ones or friends about sinful habits or talking to loved ones or friends about Chris or even accepting Christ and being baptized. Procrastinating on important spiritual matters can not only have a serious effect on our relationship with God, it can even have eternal consequences.

The apostle James expresses the importance of taking care of business today and not tomorrow. We have to realize that tomorrow may never come as James says, James 4:13 13 Now listen, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go to this or that city, spend a year there, carry on business and make money." 14 Why, you do not even know what will happen tomorrow. What is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes. Have you been putting off becoming a Christian because you are not ready to make the commitment to serve God with your whole mind, heart and soul? Don't you think it's time that you stop gambling with your soul and thinking that you will always have tomorrow. Let me tell you that Jesus is coming soon, and He will come in an hour when we think not! He will come when we aren't expecting Him. He will come at a time when we are least ready. He will come at His appointed time and we need to be always watching and waiting for that day, that hour, and that minute to come. Don't drop your guard. Don't believe the Devil's lies and let him lull you to sleep in the very House of God. Don't allow yourself to fall into apathy. Stay vigilant! Stay ready! For at the hour when you think not - that's when Jesus is coming again. Let's be found faithful to the end: ever watching and ever waiting for his soon coming. Don't let that day catch you unaware!

PASTORAL ANNOUNCEMENTS How to invest in the Future of our Children?

The most important decision that we can make for our children is how to manage our children's education, it only makes sense to ask the One who invented education.

"You shall therefore impress these words of mine on your heart and on your soul And you shall teach them to your sons, talking of them when you sit in your house and when you walk along the road and when you lie down and when you rise up." (Deuteronomy 11:18-19)

What we have here is a clear biblical mandate to saturate our children's minds with the Word of God. It's a difficult task under any circumstances, but virtually impossible in a public school setting. Once inside those doors, children spend 30 to 40 hours a week being told that God, if He exists at all, is no longer relevant. No matter how spiritually grounded your child may be, the repetition of such destructive ideas can't help but have an adverse effect.

It is a sad but true irony: public schools, the self-proclaimed shapers of the human mind, have chosen to ignore the God who created the human mind. To their chagrin, they have robbed themselves of their most valuable "textbook," and the only available source of absolute truth.

"The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom," writes Solomon. "And knowledge of the Holy. One is understanding" (Proverbs 9:10). As students pursue the knowledge of math, biology and music in a Christian setting, they're chasing after the knowledge of God. And the by-products of such an endeavor - wisdom and understanding - are the God-given rewards for which every good student strives.

One of the principal reasons that many good Christian Seventh-day Adventist Parents send their children to the public school is what they deem as academic superiority. Contrary to popular opinion, students at Christian schools consistently out-perform their public school counterparts. Their standardized test scores are way above the curve, and they're better prepared for college upon graduation. Even in the areas of math and reading, subjects that are "less spiritual" in content, students at Christian schools have proven their superiority

The truth is while you get what you want for your children, what have you and your children lost long term?

The bible tells us "that good company improves bad morals, many of us would have a welcome reprieve. Unfortunately, the opposite is true. Bad company corrupts good morals (1 Corinthians 15:33), the Apostle Paul tells us, and we can assume he was writing to a predominantly adult audience. You can imagine what he might say to a group of impressionable children and young teens.

Make no mistake: your kids will be exposed to bad company no matter where they go to school. Sometimes they may even be the bad company. But in a Christian environment, they'll be much less likely to find themselves surrounded by destructive influences, and far more likely to find positive ones.

Regardless of what you may think about Christian school, we encourage you to seek God's thoughts on the matter before choosing an academic home for your children.

HEALTH NUGGET

The Diet that Helps Allergies

Eat at least 2 servings of omega-3 rich foods daily because deficiency of this special fatty acid increases risk of allergies. Walnuts, chia seeds, spinach, soybeans, or ground flaxseed are good vegetarian sources of essential anti-inflammatory alpha linolenic acid. Although olive oil is not an omega-3 fat, it also exerts anti-inflammatory effect and can be used in moderation with good results.

Reduce any consumption of omega-6 fats (including corn, safflower, sunflower, or peanut oils). Excessive use of these fats, as opposed to omega-3 ones, tends to increase inflammation in the body.

Seriously limit sugar; it shifts body chemistry toward inflammation.

Emphasize intake of foods containing LOX inhibitors. LOX enzymes are involved in the production of pro-inflammatory leukotrienes, which are key contributors to allergies and asthma. Inhibitors reduce their formation. Fortunately, a wide variety of plant foods contain them. Anthocyanins, the phytochemicals that compose the purple, red and blue pigments in foods, are natural LOX inhibitors. Certain phytochemicals from pomegranates, garlic, onions, sesamin from sesame seeds, and resveratrol from red grapes and blueberries, inhibit both leukotrienes and another pro-inflammatory enzyme called COX-2
